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4BIZ EVENTS AND OTHER MEETINGS

The Regional Business Forum "Boosting Black Sea Blue Biz - 4BIZ"



On May 9th and 10th, 2024, the Regional Business Forum "Boosting Black Sea Blue Biz -4BIZ" took place at the Astor Garden Hotel and in the city of Varna, organized by the Marine Cluster Bulgaria. The event was part of the 4BIZ project, supported by the Enterprise Europe Network and the European Commission's initiative "European Maritime Day in My Country 2024".

The forum brought together over 70 representatives from the blue economy of the Black Sea region, including businesses and stakeholders from Bulgaria, Georgia, Romania, Turkey, Ukraine, and Spain.

The forum was opened by Mrs. Ilze Atanasova,

Chair of the Managing Board of the Marine Cluster Bulgaria. Among the official guests were Mrs. Gabriela _____ Mitova, representative of the Ministry of Transport and Communications of Bulgaria, Mr. Stanimir Apostolov, Deputy Mayor of Burgas Municipality, and Mr. Alexander Kalchev, Chairman of the Managing Board of the Bulgarian Chamber of Shipping.

In his welcome address, captain Alexander Kalchev emphasized the significant challenges facing the maritime business in the Black Sea and called for optimism and cooperation.

Mr. Stanimir Apostolov highlighted the priority of Burgas Municipality to become the blue-green gateway of Europe through investments, job creation, and marine environment preservation by 2027.

Mrs. Gabriela Mitova welcomed the organizers and participants, emphasizing the importance of joint projects to enhance cooperation and create a favorable environment for innovation and investment in the blue economy.

During the plenary session, prof. Eden Mamut, coordinator of the 4BIZ project, presented the goals and outcomes of the project. Mr. Stavros Kalognomos from the Conference of Peripheral Maritime Regions and Ms. Georgia Chantzi from the International Centre for Black Sea Studies highlighted the challenges and best European practices for the blue economy in the Black Sea region. Mr. Oscar Díaz from the Spanish maritime cluster ACLUNAGA shared Spain's experience in creating a successful business environment through the coordination of different management levels within the blue ecosystem. The session concluded with a presentation on the progress and opportunities for cooperation in the Black Sea region under the DBAN project by Mr. Georgi Sakaliev from Burgas Municipality.



A lively discussion on financial instruments and business support generated great interest, with participation from Mrs. Iliana Ivanova, Deputy Head of the Debt Financial Instruments Department at the Fund of Funds, the Fund Manager of Financial Instruments in Bulgaria and Mr. Pavel Velkov, Managing Partner at the venture capital fund Morning Side Hill Capital Management. Participants learned about new financial instruments available next year and the conditions for attracting investors, supported by successful examples.



The afternoon session presented support and financing opportunities for businesses at

various stages of their development. The first day concluded with individual B2B meetings, organized with the support of the Enterprise Europe Network, where participants established new business contacts and discussed potential partnerships.

On the second day, participants visited the Institute of Oceanology "Prof. Fridtj of Nansen" and the Institute of Fisheries Resources in Varna. They were introduced to the research activities and had the opportunity for idea exchange and future collaborations. The event concluded with a partnership meeting on the 4BIZ project.

Simultaneously, participants from the Spanish maritime cluster ACLUNAGA visited leading shipbuilding and ship repair companies and held discussions with company representatives for future joint ventures.

The Regional business forum "Boosting Black Sea Blue Biz - 4BIZ" created new perspectives for innovation and sustainable growth in the Black Sea region.

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EMD IN UKRAINE

Team Europe Mykolaiv and Ukrainian Maritime Cluster, with the support of the EU Delegation to Ukraine within the framework of European Maritime Day (EMD) 2024, successfully organized a significant event aimed at uniting key stakeholders in Ukraine's maritime industry **at the May 30**, **2024**

The event aimed to consolidate efforts among key market players, central and local authorities to safeguard and foster the development of Ukraine's maritime industry while enhancing its engagement within the European Maritime Community. A primary objective was to address the reconstruction of Ukraine's maritime sector into a

sustainable and robust structure. Discussions also highlighted the vital role of Ukraine's maritime industry in the context of European economic integration and emphasized the urgent need for maritime preservation and development.



Key Areas of Discussion Included:

- 1. Ukraine's Economic Recovery: Emphasizing the restoration of the maritime industry and Ukrainian port infrastructure.
- 2. **International Cooperation:** Exploring opportunities for mutually beneficial partnerships and development of the maritime industry, with a focus on EU policies.
- 3. Role of the Ukrainian Maritime Cluster: Discussing integration processes and the cluster's role.
- 4. **UMC Cooperation Projects:** Presenting experiences and future plans.
- 5. Ukrainian Cluster Alliance: Introduction to the Clusters 4 Ukraine initiative.
- 6. Strategy for Maritime Industry Development: Outlining strategies for sectoral growth.

Participants included leaders and managers from various sectors such as shipbuilding, ship repair, design, yacht maintenance, trade, ship freight, coastal services, marina services, marinas, crewing, and rental, alongside representatives from central and local authorities, and members of the European maritime community.

Event Highlights:

- **Networking and Opening Ceremony:** The event commenced with networking opportunities followed by opening remarks from Artem Vashchylenko, Chairman of the Supervisory Board of Ukrainian Maritime Cluster, Oleksander Senkevych, Mykolaiv City Mayor, Olena Zhukova, Executive Director of Ukrainian Maritime Cluster, and Denys Chernykov from the EU Delegation to Ukraine.
- **EU Policies and Practices:** Insights were shared on EU policies and practices towards the recovery and sustainable maritime economy of Ukraine by representatives from the EU Delegation to Ukraine.
- Blue Economy Discussion: International experts, including Rodin Genoff, Eden Mamut (coordinator 4BIZ project) Tadeusz Kopowski, explored the potential of the blue economy and strategies for its development.
- **Future Perspectives:** Discussions were held on the future perspectives and plans of the maritime community.

The event concluded with a productive discussion session and the General Assembly of the Ukrainian Maritime Cluster, setting a positive trajectory for the sustainable growth of Ukraine's maritime industry and its integration into the broader European maritime community.

4BIZ Boosting the Blue Economy in the Black Sea Region by Initiating a Business Collaboration Framework in the field of Fisheries and Aquaculture, Coastal and Maritime Tourism and Maritime Transport - is a project funded by the European Maritime, Fisheries and Aquaculture Fund (EMFAF) aiming to develop a collaboration framework that will bring together blue economy stakeholders in Black Sea countries to identify and tackle local capacity building needs to boost innovation, digitalization and investment in the Black Sea blue economy with the main focus on fisheries and aquaculture, coastal and maritime tourism and maritime transport. Identification of the key business actors and supporting them for a sustainable growth is one of the main targets of our research activity.

Strengths and weaknesses of the project:

Strengths:

- Strong project coordination that allows both to keep the project activities flux and an open discussion related to any disturbance or unexpected situation.
- Is was an extraordinary adaptation of all project partners to the new context generated by the Ukraine war
- Networking between industry experts, entrepreneurs, investors and Academia
- Discover new opportunities for collaboration and growth
- Bring together blue economy stakeholders in EU and eligible non-EU Black Sea countries to identify unique opportunity for SMEs and startups in the blue economy sector across the Blue Sea region to come together, collaborate, and tap into the wealth of knowledge
- Improving the visibility of investment opportunities in the target sectors from the Black Sea
- Created the possibility for public/private investors to identify SMEs and start-ups
- Contributing to the development of a network, multi-stakeholder blue investment and innovation ecosystem in the Black Sea region.

Weaknesses:

- The Ukraine war disturbed a lot the project activities. It was not possible to have the meetings originally planned but is was an extraordinary adaptation of all project partners to the new context
- A slight lack of openness and involvement of companies in the support activities.

Supported by the 4BIZ project, Bulgarian companies have had the opportunity to participate in numerous national and international B2B events and forums, enabling them to discover new partners, clients, and investors.

One of these innovative companies is <u>Galera 07 Ltd</u>., known for its modern solutions in maritime transport. The company specializes in small craft design and production shipbuilding and has delivered several innovative vessels in recent years, including fully electric-powered vessels. Galera 07 Ltd. is also behind a project to build the first electric yacht in Bulgaria.

Another example of a company driving innovation in this sector is <u>Solumar Ltd</u>. - a Bulgarian startup that provides solutions to reduce harmful emissions in industrial enterprises, maritime transport, and port infrastructure. The startup team has developed a new technology for air and gas purification that captures 92-99% of all types of emissions (mechanical particles, soot, volatile organic compounds, and gases (CO2, SOx, NOx)).

Solumar's systems are custom-designed regardless of size, type, and nominal airflow, and do not require significant infrastructural changes.

Marine Cluster Bulgaria is actively working towards the development of the blue economy in Bulgaria and the region. The Cluster supports companies in the maritime sectors in their growth and helps them access international markets.

Following the official completion of the project, Marine Cluster Bulgaria will continue to support Bulgarian companies and work towards the development of innovations and the blue economy in Bulgaria and the region.

The 4BIZ project, supported by the European Maritime, **Fisheries** and Aquaculture Fund (EMFAF), has an important place for our institution as it is the first EU Blue Economy project carried out by DOKA has enabled us to make new contacts, prepare more EU Blue economy projects. Thanks to this project, we had the opportunity to strengthen and expand our regional connections with the countries in the Black Sea Basin by increasing our international cooperation. We came together with experts and sector representatives from different countries, shared our experiences and produced common solutions. This allowed us to support each other in the international arena and create an

opportunity for mutual learning. We have deepened and enriched our knowledge on different components of the blue economy.

The following can be given as examples to region wide collaboration examples. Aquaculture and ship building companies of Trabzon (Mimarine Ship Building and Yomra Aquaculture Companies) have established business contact in Batumi Brokerage Event and Varna Business Forum with Georgian and Bulgarian companies. Companies agreed to visit each other to make further agreements about manufacturing, marketing subjects. By means of the initiatives of BSUN, with Turkish and Georgian Transportation Ministries, the ferry cruises between Batumi and Trabzon has been brought to agenda. Further contacts with Trabzon and Batumi will be made to make a deal with both sides for the start of the ferry cruises. For this reason, Mimarine ship building company is planned to have a visit to ANCONAV (The Romanian Shipbuilders Association) in Constanta.

One of the valuable contributions of this project for us is that it encourages us to place the blue economy at the center of our institution's future vision with the inspiration it provides. With the contribution of the experience and background gained in the 4BIZ project, the Blue Economy Results-Oriented Program (ROP), which our Agency will implement between 2024-2028, was created. Within the scope of ROP, it is planned to establish intra-regional, inter-regional and nationwide collaborations. Collaborations will be developed within the scope of capacity building, project preparation, investment and promotion activities.

In addition, under Interreg Next Black Sea Basin Program of which one of the main priorities is Blue&Smart Region, DOKA as a leader partner has applied a Blue Economy project in 2023 with the partners (Recep Tayyip Erdoğan University, Burgas Municipality, Odesa National Maritime University and The Black Sea Universities Network) from Türkiye, Bulgaria, Ukraine and Romania. The project called "Blue Gates" was approved. DOKA will sustain its cooperation and partnership successfully with BSUN in Blue Gates project such as 4BIZ project. This is an indication that the collaborations and networks established within the scope of the project will be continued. As a result, we see the project as a gain for us in every aspect.



The lacks of the project can be stated as there has been no study and site visits to review the good and best practices of developed EU countries within the activities of the project. Budget constraints were one of the important reasons of this deficiency.

In Eastern Black Sea Region (TR90) of Türkiye the locomotive blue economy sector is aquaculture and fisheries. In this sector the following companies are identified as leading companies in terms of production and export in TR90 Region.

I)Kuzuoğlu Grup(Kuzuoğlu Group Inc.

Operates especially in aquaculture and processing of Turkish Salmon(rainbow trout which its last stages of aquaculture period takes place in Black Sea) .The company established in 1974 is the first company that farms and processes different species of trout including Turkish Salmon in Black Sea Region.
