


Åbo Akademi University Turku/Åbo Finland


Royal Academy was established 1640 in Turku/Åbo by Queen Kristina during the good old Swedish time in Finland It was closed by the Russian emperor Nikolaj I after the Turku fire 1827

The resurrection of academic education in Turku/Åbo took place after Finnish independence (1917): 1918 Åbo Akademi University, 1920 University of Turku - both were private universities

Chemical engineering education started at Åbo Akademi 1.7.1920 – a revolutionary step!

Main players in research and innovation in Scandinavian countries Finland (FI), Denmark (DK), Iceland (IS), Norway (NO) and Sweden (SE)

- Universities: a dense network of universities serving not only the global science but the different parts of the country (Finland: Åbo Akademi University, University of Turku, University of Helsinki, University of Tampere, University of Jyväskylä, University of Eastern Finland, University of Oulu, University of Lapland,...; Denmark: University of Copenhagen, Technical University of Denmark, University of Århus, University of Ålborg, University of Southern Denmark)
- **Research institutes** (VTT (FI), LUKE (FI), YKI (SE), SINTEF (NO)...)
- Enterprises (industrial research activities are large exportation is a necessity for us – high tech!)

Financing of the research and innovation (1)

Principle of pluralism is characteristic for Scandinavian countries - different kinds of financial sources - diversity

- Direct state financing to universities, from the annual budget of the country (e.g. Åbo Akademi University about 60% of the university's annual budget)
 - Financing from Academy of Finland (FI, annually 500 megaeuro), Vetenskapsrådet (SE, annually 800 megaeuro)
- Financing from technology organizations, e.g. Business Finland (FI), Vinnova (SE) – collaboration between universities, research centra and industry

Financing of the research and innovation (2)

Principle of pluralism is characteristic for Scandinavian countries - different kinds of financial sources - diversity

- Financing from European Union (EU): EU projects, ERC grants, Erasmus (student mobility)
 - Direct financing from enterprises often limited to really big players (Statoil (NO), Neste (FI), Wartsila (FI), Haldor Topsoe (DK), UPM (FI), Stora-Enso (SE-FI), Novo (DK), Volvo (SE)...)
- Financing from very large private foundations Scandinavia is the region of great donators (Wallenberg Foundation (SE), Kempe Foundation (SE), Carlsberg Foundation (DK), Neste-Forum Foundation (FI), J & A. Erkko Foundation (FI), Finnish Cultural Foundation (FI, >40 megaeuro/year), Svenska kulturfonden (FI, 40 megaeuro/year)...






Criteria for state financing of Finnish universities

- Number of Bachelor, Master's and Doctoral degrees three-years moving average is used
- 2. Publication activities (articles in international journals, a national ranking system of international journals is in use; a similar ranking system is applied in Denmark and Norway)
- 3. Strategic visions, profiling areas of the university (e.g. Åbo Akademi University has the profiling areas: Minority research, The Sea, Technologies for a sustainable future, Solutions for health)







Microreactor system




