RESCUU PROJECT INFORMATION

Implementation period: January 2023 – June 2024

The RESCUU project is aimed at contributing to the resilience of wartime Ukraine's educational institutions and will support Ukrainian teachers, students and researchers who remain in Ukraine and work or study at Ukrainian universities. The goal of the project is to help colleagues and students to be prepared to take an active role in post-war reconstruction. The project activities are open for the students and teachers at all BUP participating universities in Ukraine.

This project will provide several events, both online and physical, aimed at the target groups mentioned above. The content of the events will be focused on knowledge and experiences needed to overcome the consequences of the war, as well as problems of sustainability in connection to the war in terms of social life, environment etc. By participating in international events within the framework of the project, teachers and students will establish contacts for collaboration with universities in the Baltic Sea Region.
